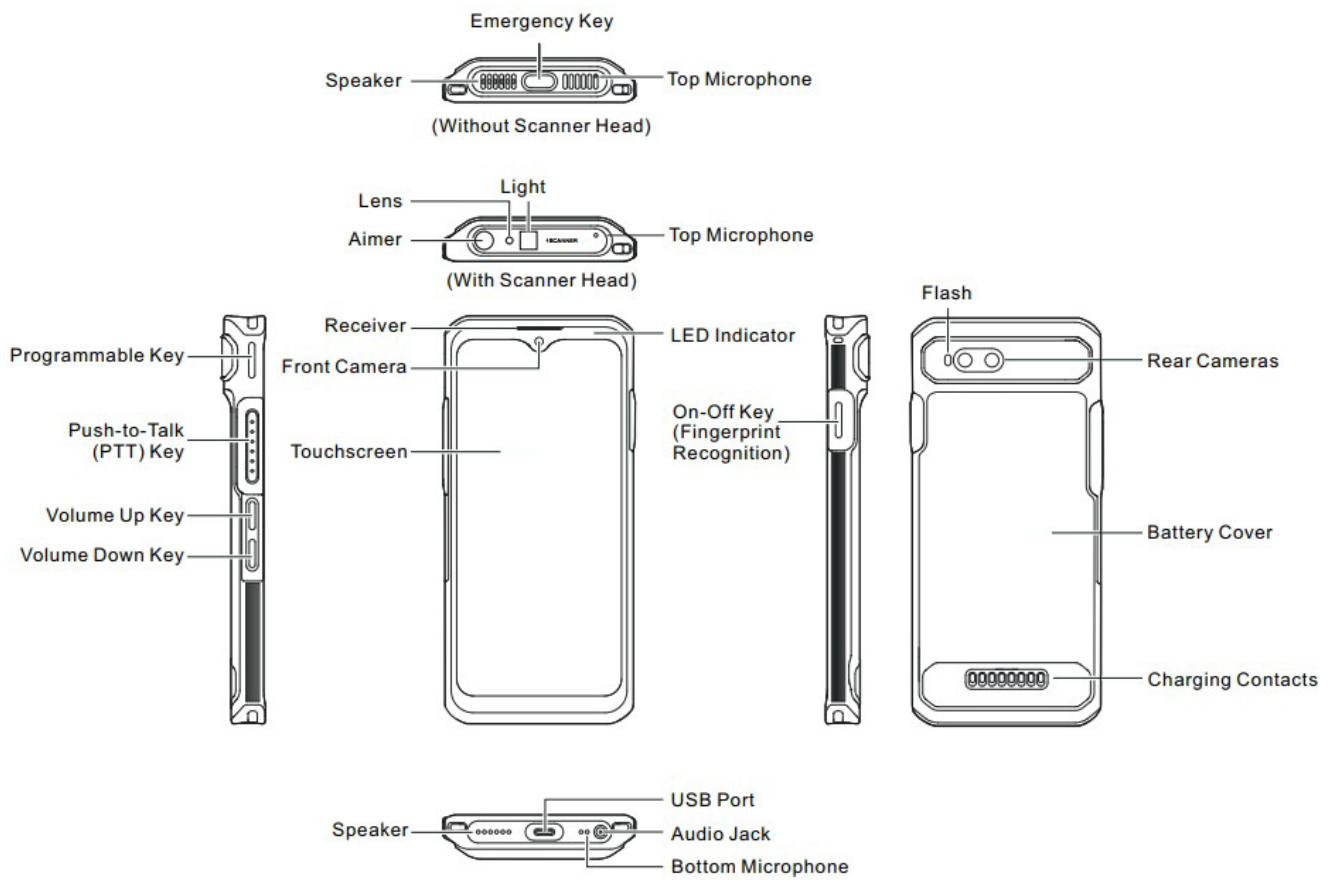

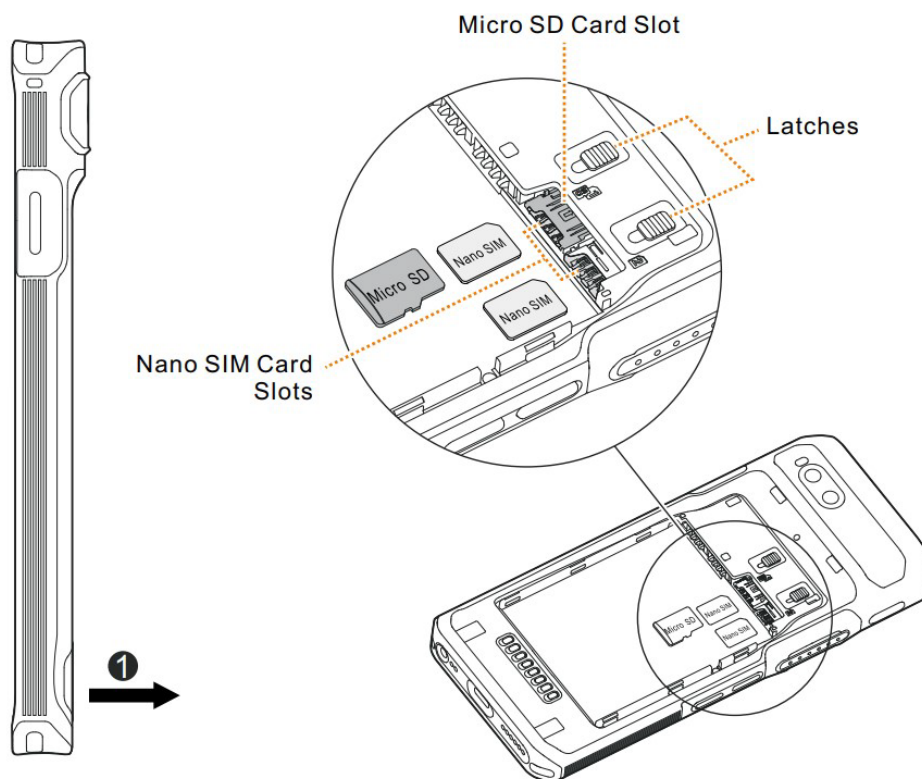

3. Before Use

3.1 Install the Cards

1. Remove the battery cover.
2. Insert the Nano SIM cards and the Micro SD card into the corresponding slots with the metal contacts facing down.



NOTE

To remove the Nano SIM card, slide the latch to eject the corresponding card.

3.2 Attach the Battery

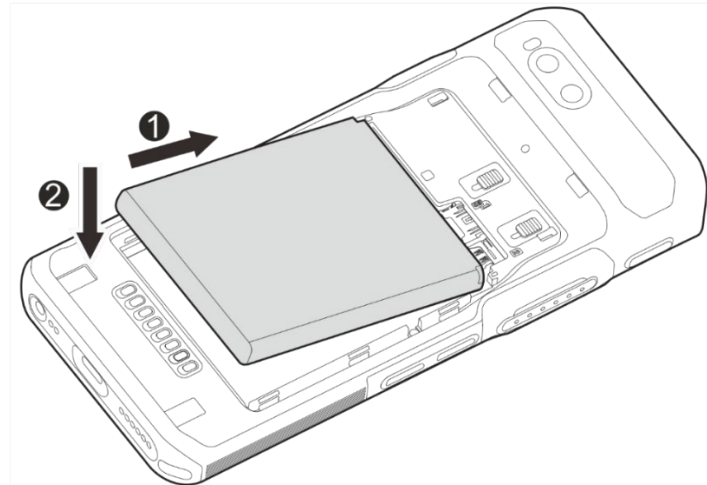
CAUTION

- Use the approved battery to avoid the risk of explosion.
- Dispose of the used battery according to "Precautions for Disposal" in the *Safety Information Booklet*.
- Turn off the device before replacing the battery to avoid data loss.

1. Remove the battery cover.

2. Align the contacts on the battery with those on the battery slot, and then slide the battery into the slot.
3. Put the battery cover back in place.

3.3 Charge the Battery

CAUTION

- Use the approved charger to charge the battery.
- Read the Safety Information Booklet before charging.
- The remaining lithium-ion battery power is limited to 30% pursuant to the new lithium battery shipment regulation approved by the International Air Transport Association (IATA).

Connect the product to the power adapter, power bank, or PC through the USB data cable.

During charging, check the charging status through the battery icon or percentage on the touchscreen.

4. Basic Operations

4.1 Turn On the Device


Long press the **On-Off** key until the startup screen appears.

4.2 Turn Off the Device

- Method 1

Long press the **On-Off** key, and then select **Power off**.

- Method 2


- Swipe down from the status bar.
- Swipe down from the control center to unfold it.
- Tap .
- Tap **Power off**.

4.3 Restart the Device

- Method 1

Long press the **On-Off** key, and then select **Restart**.

- Method 2

- Swipe down from the status bar.
- Swipe down from the control center to unfold it.
- Tap .
- Tap **Restart**.

NOTE

If the device fails to work and be turned off, you can long press the **On-Off** key for more than 10s to forcibly restart the device.

4.4 Adjust the Volume



High sound pressure with hearing damage risk. Do not listen at high volume levels for long periods.

Through the Volume Key





- Media Volume

Press the **Volume Up** key to increase the media volume, or the **Volume Down** key to decrease the media volume.


- Ring and Notification Volume

a. Press the **Volume Up** key or **Volume Down** key.

b. Do any of the following:

- To vibrate the ring and notification, tap the upper icon on the volume bar, and then select .
- To mute the ring and notification, tap the upper icon on the volume bar, and then select .
- To increase or decrease the ring and notification volume, tap the lower  icon on the volume bar, and then drag the slider corresponding with **Ring & notification volume**.
- **PoC** Call and Alarm Volume
 - a. Press the **Volume Up** key or **Volume Down** key.
 - b. Tap the lower  icon on the volume bar.
 - c. To increase or decrease the **PoC** call or alarm volume, drag the slider corresponding with **PoC Call volume** or **Alarm volume**.

Through the Sound Interface


1. Tap .
2. Tap **Sound**.
3. Drag the slider corresponding with **Media volume**, **PoC Call volume**, **Ring & notification volume**, and **Alarm volume**.

4.5 Use the SIM Cards



The device supports Dual SIM Dual Standby, but cannot access voice services or data services of the two SIM cards simultaneously.

4.5.1 Set the SIM Card Preference

You can set a SIM card as the default one for the Internet, ~~calls~~, and messages.

1. Tap .
2. Tap **Network & internet**.
3. Select one SIM card.
4. Do any of the following.
 - Tap **Data preference**, and then select the SIM card, which you want to use to access the network.

4.5.2 Enable or Disable the SIM Card



1. Tap .
2. Tap **Network & internet**.
3. Select one SIM card.
4. Tap  following **Use SIM**.

NOTE

To custom the name and color of the SIM card, tap  in the upper right corner.

4.5.3 Auto-Switch the Network

With Smart Switch Network Card enabled, the device can automatically switch to the SIM card with stronger network signals.

1. Tap .
2. Tap **Network & internet**.
3. Tap  following **Smart switch network card**.



4.6 Manage the Battery


You can check the battery usage, enable Battery Saver to extend the battery life, and set whether to display the battery percentage in the status bar.

4.6.1 Enable the Battery Saver

Battery Saver can reduce power consumption. If turned on, Battery Saver switches the device into dark mode, decreases the sleep time, and limits background activities.

- Manually enable Battery Saver
 - In the control center, tap **Battery Saver**, and then tap **TURN ON**.

- Tap , go to **Battery** > **Battery Saver**, and then tap  following **User Battery Saver**.
- Automatically enable Battery Saver
 - a. Tap **Set a schedule**.
 - b. Tap **Based on percentage**.
 - c. Drag the slider to a percentage where you want the device to turn on Battery Saver automatically.



Once the battery reaches the preset value, the Battery Saver will be automatically enabled.
- Automatically disable the Battery Saver
Tap  following **Turn off when charged**.

When the battery is over 90%, Battery Saver will be automatically disabled.

NOTE

During charging, Battery Saver cannot be enabled.

4.6.2 Set the Remaining Battery Display

1. Tap .
2. Tap **Battery**.
3. Tap  following **Battery percentage**.

The remaining battery percentage will be displayed in the status bar.

4.7 Manage the Storage

You can check the storage usage and free up space for better use.



To extend the storage space, install a Micro SD card in the device.

1. Tap .
2. Tap **Storage**.
3. Do either of the following:
 - To manually free up the storage space, tap **Free up space**.
 - To automatically free up the storage space regularly, tap  following **Storage manager**.

4.8 Manage the Notification

4.8.1 Turn Off the App Notification

You can turn off notifications from an app.

1. Tap .
2. Tap **Notifications** > **App settings**.
3. Tap  following the app.



NOTE

Notifications from some apps cannot be turned off.



4.8.2 Disable the Notification Dot

You can set no dot to be displayed on the app icon when the app receives notifications.

1. Tap .
2. Tap **Notifications** > **App settings**.
3. Tap the app.
4. Tap  following **Allow notification dot**. **Notification**

Dot of All Apps

1. Tap .
2. Tap **Notifications**.
3. Tap  following **Notification dot on app icon**.

4.8.3 Set the Notification Dot

1. Tap .
2. Tap **Notifications**.
3. In the **Notifications** interface, do any of the followings:
 - To allow some conversations to float on top of other apps, tap  following **Bubbles**.
 - To show notifications on lock screen, tap  following **Notifications on lock screen**.
 - To hide silent notifications in status bar, tap  following **Hide silent notifications in status bar**.

- To allow notification alert after the preset time, tap  **Allow notification snoozing**.
- To set the alert time, in the notification center, tap  unfold an unread notification, and then tap  in the lower right corner of the notification.
- To allow the LED indicator to blink when the device receives notifications, tap  following **Blink light**.

4.9 Check the Device Information

1. Tap .
2. Tap **About phone**.

You can see the device name, SIM card status, legal information, International Mobile Equipment Identity (IMEI), model, Android™ 12, and more.



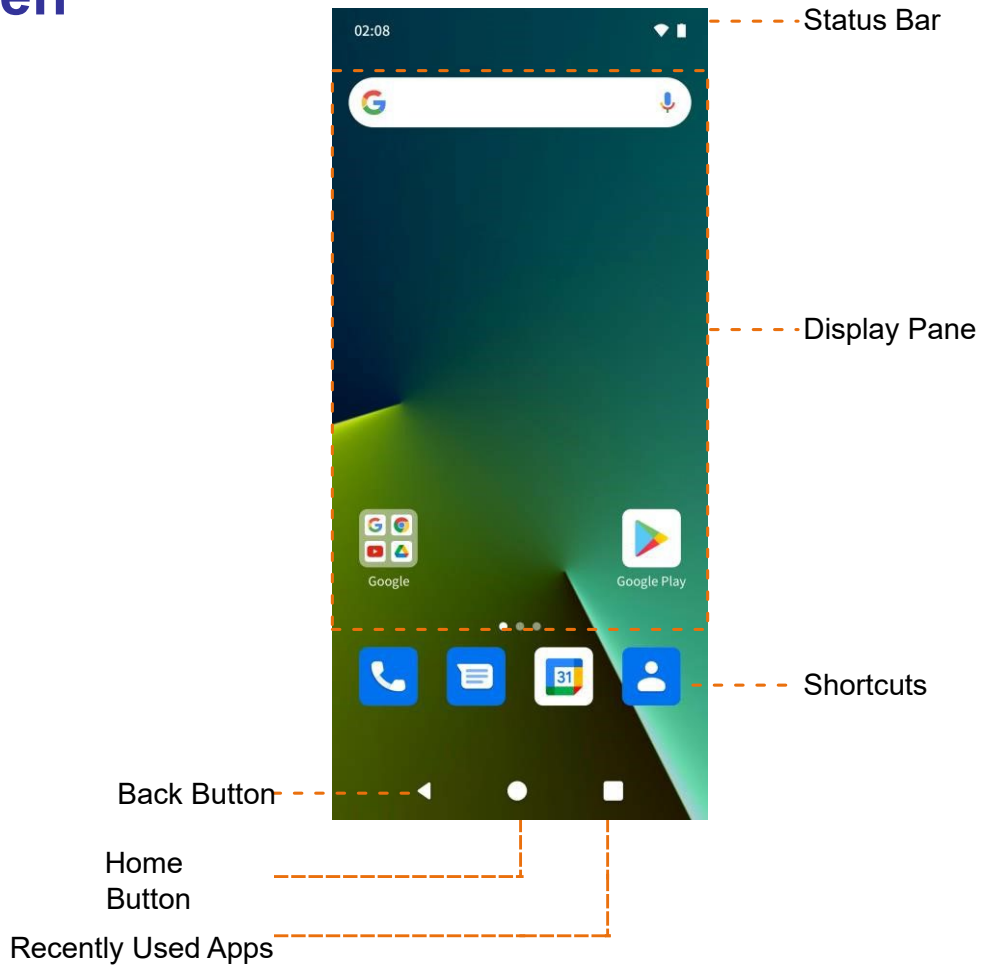

4.10 Set the USB Connection Mode with PC









1. Connect the device to the PC through the USB data cable.
2. Swipe down from the top.
3. Tap **Charging this device via USB**.
4. Tap **Tap for more options**.
5. In the **USB Preferences** interface, select one of the following options:
 - File Transfer: allows you to transfer files between the device and the PC.
 - USB tethering: allows you to share the network of the PC.
 - MIDI: allows you to use the device as a musical instrument digital interface (MIDI) input device and play music on the PC.
 - PTP: allows you to transfer pictures to the PC.
 - No data transfer: allows you to only charge the device by the PC.

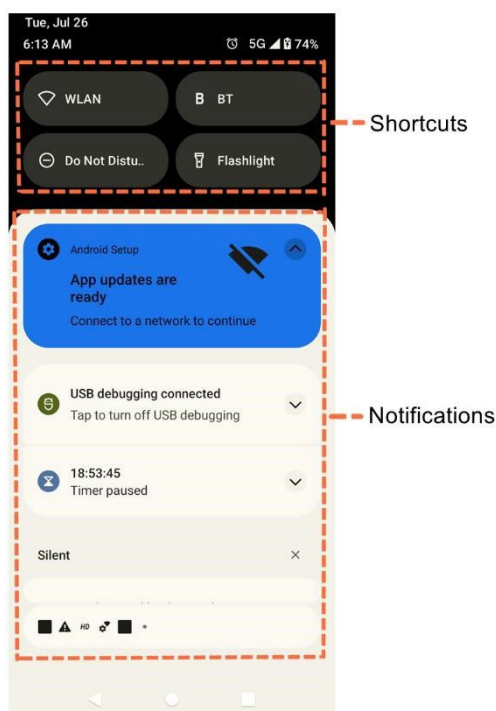

5.2 Understand the Control and Notification Center




The control and notification center allows you to instantly access frequently used features by using shortcut switches, adjust the screen brightness, and view or clear the notifications.

To access the control center, swipe down from the status bar.

To view all shortcuts, swipe down from the control center.



5.3 Set the Home Screen

1. On the home screen, touch and hold the blank area, and then select **Home settings**.
 2. In the **Home settings** interface, do any of the following:
 - To show the notification dots, tap **Notification dots**, and then tap  following **Notification dot on app icon**.
 - To add app icons to home screen, tap  following **Add app icons to Home screen**.
 - To show Google apps, tap  following **Show Google App**.
 - To set the app sort type, tap **App sort type**, and then select **Sort App by Name** or **Sort App by First Install Time**.
- Screen

5.4 Manage the Widget

The widget allows you to quickly access apps.

- To add a widget, do the following:
 - a. On the home screen, touch and hold the blank area, and then select **Widgets**.
 - b. In the app list, tap an app.
 - c. Touch and hold a widget, and then drag it to the blank area on the home screen.
- To move the widget, drag it to a new location.
- To remove a widget, drag it to **Remove** at the top.

5.5 Capture the Screen

1. Press the **On-Off** key and the **Volume Down** key simultaneously.
2. (Optional) To view the screenshot, tap **Photos**.

5.6 Record the Screen

1. Swipe down from the status bar.
2. Swipe down from the control center to unfold it.
3. (Optional) Swipe left to find **Screen record**.

4. Tap **Screen record**.



5.7 Cast the Screen

1. Swipe down from the status bar.
2. Swipe down from the control center to unfold it.
3. (Optional) Swipe left to find **Screen cast**.
4. Tap **Screen cast**.

5.8 Auto-Rotate the Screen

Auto-Rotate Screen allows the device to automatically switch between portrait and landscape orientations when you Screen

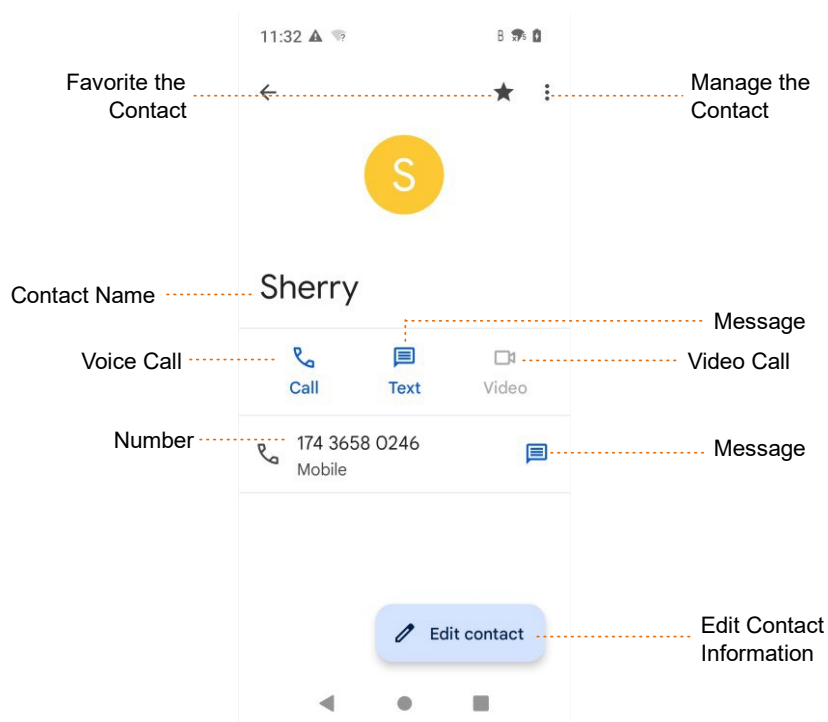
rotate the device.

- Method 1
 - a. Swipe down from the status bar.
 - b. Swipe down from the control center to unfold it.
 - c. (Optional) Swipe left to find **Auto-rotate**.
 - d. Tap **Auto-rotate**.
- Method 2
 - a. Tap .

 - c. Tap  following **Auto-rotate screen**.

7.1 Mobile Network



7.1.1 Enable the Mobile Network







Before accessing the cellular network services, ensure that you have properly installed the SIM card. If the cellular network services are not in use, you can turn off it to decrease data usage and increase battery life.

- Method 1
 - a. Tap .
 - b. Go to **Network & internet** > **Mobile network**.
 - c. Tap  following **Use SIM**.
 - d. Tap  following **Mobile data**.
- Method 2
 - a. Swipe down from the status bar.
 - b. Swipe down from the control center to unfold it.
 - c. (Optional) Swipe left to find **Mobile data**.
 - d. Tap **Mobile data**.

7.1.2 Set the Mobile Network

1. Tap .
2. Go to **Network & internet** > **Mobile network**.
3. Do any of the following:

If You Want to...	Then...
Enable data roaming	Tap  following Roaming . You can access data services when you are outside the service area of your carrier.
Enable Voice over LTE (VoLTE)	Tap  following VoLTE . The device uses LTE services to improve voice communications.


Enable 5G	Tap  following Enable 5G .  NOTE
If You Want to...	Then...
	Before accessing the 5G network services, ensure that you have installed the SIM card with 5G services enabled.
Select the 2G, 3G, 4G, or 5G network,	Tap Preferred network type .  NOTE Only when 5G is enabled, you can select 5G network.

1. Tap .
2. Go to **Network & internet** > **Mobile network** > **App data usage**.

You can see the data usage of every app.

7.1.4 Limit the Data Usage

1. Tap .
2. Go to **Network & internet** > **Mobile network** > **Data warning & limit**.
3. Do any of the following:

7.2 WLAN



7.2.1 Connect to the WLAN

With successful WLAN connection, you can visit the Internet or shared media from other devices in the network.

1. Tap .
2. Go to **Network & internet > WLAN**.
3. Tap  following **Use WLAN**.
4. Select a network from the list.
 - If you select an open network, the device automatically connects to it.
 - If you select a secure network, you need to enter the password before connection.
 - If no network in the list, do the following:
 - i. Tap **Add network**.
 - ii. Enter the network name or scan the QR code to add the network.

7.2.2 Set the WLAN



1. Tap .
2. Go to **Network & internet > WLAN**.
3. Do any of the following:

If You Want to...	Then...
Enable automatic WLAN connection when a highquality public network is available	1. Tap WLAN preferences .
If You Want to...	Then...
	2. Tap  following Turn on WLAN automatically .
Receive a notification when a high-quality public network is available	1. Tap WLAN preferences . 2. Tap  following Notify for public networks .
Check saved networks	Tap Saved networks .
Delete saved networks	1. Tap Saved networks . 2. Tap the WLAN. 3. Tap FORGET .

7.2.3 Print through WLAN

You can connect the device to a printer through WLAN and print pictures or files. Take picture printing for example.



1. Add a printer.

- a. Tap .
- b. Go to **Connected devices > Connection preference > Printing > Default Print Service**.
- c. Tap  following **Use print service**.

The device searches for available printers automatically.

- d. Tap the printer name.


2. Print the picture.









- a. Tap **Photos**.
- b. Tap a picture.
- c. In the upper right corner, tap .
- d. Go to **Print >  > All printers...**
- e. Select a printer.

- f. Follow the on-screen instructions.

7.3 Hotspot and Tethering

Hotspot and Tethering allows the device to share the mobile network connection with nearby devices.

1. Tap .
2. Go to **Network & internet > Hotspot & tethering**.
3. Do any of the following:



If You Want to Share Mobile Network...	Then...
Through WLAN hotspot	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Tap WLAN hotspot. 2. Tap  following Use WLAN hotspot. 3. Set the hotspot name, security, and password. <p> NOTE</p> <p>To enable the saved hotspot, you can tap Hotspot in the control center.</p>
Through USB tethering	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Connect the device to the PC through the USB cable. 2. Tap  following USB tethering.
Through BT tethering	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Tap  following BT tethering. 2. Tap  twice back to the Settings interface. 3. Go to Connected devices > Previously connected devices. 4. Tap  following the device. 5. Tap  following Internet access. <p> NOTE</p> <p>Before BT tethering, pair and connect the device with and to peripheral BT devices. For details, see 9.4.1 Pair a Peripheral BT Device.</p>

9.4 BT

BT allows the device to exchange files with another BT-enabled device over short distances.

7.4.1 Pair a Peripheral BT Device

1. Enable BT.

- Tap , go to **Connected devices** > **Connection preference** > **BT**, and then tap  following **Use BT**.
- Swipe down from the top to enter the control center, and then tap **BT**.

The device automatically detects available BT devices, and can be detected by other BT devices.

2. Tap **Pair new device**.


3. From the **Available devices** list, tap a device to pair.

4. Tap **PAIR**.

5. Wait for the BT device to respond to the BT pairing request.

After the peripheral BT device accepts the BT pairing request, the device can exchange files with the peripheral BT device.

NOTE

To forget the paired device, tap  following the device under the **Previously connected devices** list, and then tap **FORGET**.

7.4.2 Share a File Through BT

Many apps allow the device to exchange data with other devices through the BT. Take **Photos** as an example.

To send photos or videos through the BT, do the following:

1. Tap **Photos**.

2. Touch and hold the picture or video.

3. Tap .

4. Select .

5. Tap the peripheral BT device from the **Available devices** list.

When the peripheral BT device accepts the request, the device will send the file to the peripheral BT device.

6. (Optional) To view the received file, go to **Connected devices** > **Connection preferences** > **Files received via BT**.



7.4.3 Rename the Device

The device name for BT connection is the device model by default.

1. In the **Pair new device** interface, tap **Device name**.
2. Enter a new name.
3. Tap **RENAME**.

7.5 NFC

Near Field Communication (NFC) allows the device to exchange data with other devices with a quick touch.


1. Tap .
2. Go to **Connected devices > Connection preference > NFC**.
3. Tap  following **NFC**.

7.6 VPN

A virtual private network (VPN) extends a private network across a public network. Apps running across the VPN can benefit from the functionality, security, and management of the private network.

NOTE



- Before setting up a VPN, you must enable the screen lock (pattern or password).
 - For detailed configuration, consult your dealer.

1. Tap .
2. Go to **Network & internet > VPN**.
3. Tap **+**.
4. Edit the VPN profile such as VPN name, server address, username, and password.
5. Tap **SAVE**.

7.7 Airplane Mode

When you are on an airplane or in an area with radio restrictions, you may be required to make the device enter the airplane mode. In airplane mode, you cannot use voice or data services. However, you can use services over WLAN network or BT, initiate narrowband services, and use apps that require no cellular data connection.



 - b. Tap **Network & internet**.
 - c. Tap  following **Airplane mode**.
- Method 2
 - a. Swipe down from the status bar.
 - b. Swipe down from the control center to unfold it.
 - c. (Optional) swipe left to find **Airplane mode**.
 - d. Tap **Airplane mode**.


8. Safety and Security


8.1 Set the Emergency Information

1. Tap .
2. Tap **Safety & emergency**.
3. Do any of the following:

Add medical information and emergency contacts	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Tap Emergency information. 2. Under Medical information, tap Add information, and then fill out the information. 3. Tap  to go back to the Emergency information interface. 4. Under Emergency contacts, tap Add contact, and then tap a contact.
Turn on Emergency Call	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Tap Emergency SOS. 2. Tap  following Use Emergency SOS. 3. Tap Call for help. 4. Set the emergency number. <p>When in emergency, quickly press the On-Off key for five consecutive times, and the device will dial the emergency number automatically.</p>
Turn on emergency alerts and set alert types	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Tap Wireless emergency alerts. 2. Tap  following Allow alerts. 3. Under Alerts, tap Extreme threats, Severe threats, AMBER alerts, or Test alerts to turn on the corresponding alert.

8.2 Use the COVID-19 Exposure Notifications

1. Tap .
2. Tap **Google**.
3. Tap **COVID-19 Exposure Notifications**.

4. Tap **Select your region**.
5. Select a region.
6. Tap **Done**.
7. Tap  following **Use Exposure Notifications**.



8.3 Set the Privacy

- To check apps that used permissions in the last 24 hours, tap **Privacy dashboard**.
- To set app's access to data, tap **Permission manager**.
- To allow the device to display password characters briefly as you type it, tap  following **Show passwords**.
 - To allow notifications on lock screen, tap  following **Notifications on lock screen**.
- To allow a message prompt when app access text, images, or other copied content, tap  following **Show clipboard access**.

8.4 Lock the App

You can set a password to lock apps to prevent unauthorized access.

To add a lock for an app, do the following:

1. Tap .
2. Go to **Security > AppLock**.
3. Enter the password, and then tap **Continue**.
4. Enter the password again, and then tap **Sure**.
5. Search the app you want to lock.
6. Tap  following the app.

In the **AppLock** interface, you can also change the app lock password as follows:


1. Tap **Change Password**.
2. Enter the new password twice.

8.5 Set the Screen Unlock Mode

When the screen is not in use, you can lock it to avoid unintended operations, protect privacy, and increase battery life.


When the screen is locked, you can still open the camera, and receive messages and notifications.

8.5.1 Set the Pattern or Password Unlock

1. Tap .
2. Go to **Security > Screen lock**.
3. Tap **Swipe, Pattern, PIN, or Password**.

When the screen is locked, swipe up, draw the pattern, or enter the pin or password to unlock the screen.


8.5.2 Set the Fingerprint Unlock

1. Tap .
2. Go to **Security > Fingerprint**.
3. Select **Fingerprint + Pattern, Fingerprint + PIN, or Fingerprint + Password**.
4. Set the pattern, pin, or password, and then tap **Next**.
5. Draw the pattern or enter the pin or password again, and then tap **Confirm**.
6. Select **Show all notification content, Show sensitive content only when unlocked, or Don't show notification at all**, and then tap **Done**.
7. Swipe up the screen, and then tap **I agree**.
